


Alina Radu,

director and co-founder of ZdG:

The year 2022 began for ZdG with a hole in the budget and a war at our borders, a situation that continued with rising inflation, prices, lack of paper for newsprint, higher electricity prices and the sometimes spontaneous disconnection of it, but also with the need to work twice as much in the newsroom: from journalists to managers, everyone worked twice as much. Nevertheless, ZdG went through this year with dignity, responsibility, involvement and very good results.

THE NEWSROOM THAT RESISTED



In 2022, the ZdG team published 10,265 texts on the web page, issued 48 editions of newspapers, which were delivered to villages and cities in all districts of Moldova, developed several hundred video materials placed on the YouTube page and on social networks, which attracted readers and followers from more than 30 countries in the world.


Victor Moșneag, editor-in-chief:

The year 2022 was full of challenges. The war that started in February changed our plans and made us adapt on the fly to the needs of the readers and the actuality of those days. Because journalists are always at the front line of the informational wave, it was not easy for us, as people, to get over the multiple emotional shocks when we saw terrible images that showed innocent children and adults dying a few

hundred kilometers away. Even though at the beginning of the year many Moldovan citizens, fearing the extension of the war, chose to leave the country, my colleagues all remained on Guard, in the country and put, as always, the public interest above their personal interest. We accepted the reality and continued to do what we know best: we wrote, filmed, investigated and explained accurately and courageously about the new realities. And the fact that people trusted us, supported us, called us and helped us with information, mattered enormously for our mental health. Probably, it is not a coincidence that in this difficult year, in which we got out of our comfort zone, we finally managed to reach the largest number of subscribers in the entire history of ZdG.

THREATS AND LEGAL PROCEEDINGS

During 2022, ZdG reporters continued to be summoned to court, being sued by various public figures, including prosecutors, and judges. In 2022 ZdG won in 2 lawsuits. including the one from the former president of the state, Igor Dodon. At the end of 2022 there were still 8 cases against ZdG in the court.



On September 30, 2022, after the publication of the video version of the ZdG investigation about the protesters paid by the Shor Party, a person posted a message of death threat by beheading in the comments on the ZdG YouTube page. "Someone will cut off your head, I take responsibility for these words. "We will cut off your head, from the throat," reads that message. On this case ZdG filed a complaint with the police.

Also, on an Internet page, aggressive people exposed the phone numbers of ZdG reporters who worked on the investigation about the paid protesters, with hate messages and slander.

At the protest of November 6, 2022, ZdG reporter Anatolie Eşanu was intimidated, and verbally assaulted by two men participating in the protest. "Why are you filming? Go to hell!"; "Get out of here with your camera, you idiot!". And one participant even went as far as direct threats. Here is a short filmed dialogue:

Protester: Take down the camera, you idiot, or you'll suffer the consequences...



ZDG – THE LARGEST INVESTIGATION GROUP

Natalia Zaharescu, investigative reporter

During 2022 Ziarul de Gardă continued to be the largest journalistic investigative group and delivered weekly to its audience on all platforms investigative articles and follow-up stories to the most impactful investigations. Many of these stories were <u>followed and discussed by readers</u>, but they also had a wider impact, such as investigations initiated by law enforcement agencies based on the facts of corruption identified and described by our editorial staff.



In 2022 Ziarul de Gardă got the award for the best investigation of the year at the Annual Gala of the Press Club, organized by the Center for Independent Journalism, for "Protesters to rent". This investigation was one of the most difficult activities, because ZdG journalists had to work undercover, to get into the middle of this criminal network of paid protest organizers.



"It was clear, the only way to prove it was to see it with our own eyes. To see those people, talk to them as equals, not with a microphone in hand, to understand what motivates them and, ultimately, how much their "civic activism" costs. To try to find out as much as possible, but without being suspicious and without standing out. To be docile protesters and at the same time agile journalists. Attention to detail and the spirit of observation are very handy when you can't write down everything you see in a notebook", explained reporter Natalia Zaharescu in an editorial on this topic.





Also this year, investigative reporters from ZdG continued to monitor the wealth and properties of officials, but also their correspondence to the declared incomes. Among the most read investigative materials were the stories about the apartment of a former judge and the house of a former minister and former deputy mayor. In both cases there were prompt reactions: the judge withdrew her notice of sale, the National Integrity Authority reacted, and the then deputy mayor made a statement that hastened the publication of the investigation.



Victoria Borodin,

investigative reporter:

"Monitoring wealth has been a challenge, as we have found that subjects are becoming more resourceful in hiding unjustified wealth and resorting to intimidation, even populist ones, when they find themselves in the media's sights. The violations and illegalities committed by people in public positions remain in our attention, and I want to believe that in the next disclosures publicized by Ziarul de Gardă, the institutions responsible for monitoring assets will react faster than they did last year."

Also in 2022, the Independent Press Association offered awards for the Best Investigations of 2021 in the national press, which went to ZdG for the investigations on the forgers of COVID-19 vaccination certificates, but also for the investigations on the Stolen Railway of Moldova and the "How 14 million lei allocated from the state budget for a cultural center's renovation work "disappeared".









ZDG – UP-TO-THE-MINUTE

NEWS ON CORRUPTION, JUSTICE, HUMAN RIGHTS

In 2022, ZdG journalists had the most difficult task - to produce up-to-the-minute news about everything happening in Moldova: reforms, corruption, and justice. Then, in February, when the Russian war in Ukraine began, their task became even more complicated - to follow and report on war every day, in parallel with the news about everything that was happening in Moldova. Journalists from ZdG held a LIVETEXT for each day of the war.





The most popular news during the year related to the war, but also to social issues, indexation of pensions, compensations, the economic and financial situation in Moldova. In 2022, ZdG relaunched the web page www.zdg.md, which was renewed, becoming friendly also for mobile users.

Milena Onisim,

Săptămâna de Gardă:

"Although we don't have a special place set up for filming, together with my colleagues, every week I make efforts to ensure that our audience is correctly informed about the most important events on the daily agenda. From the viewers' feedback, I understand that we are on the right track, as more and more people are watching the ZdG synthesis. This makes me extremely happy, but I hope that in the coming period we will bring the show to another level."

Oxana Roșca,

News Reporter:

"One of the most stressful moments happened in November 2022, when the electricity was disconnected in several regions of the country, including the capital and the newsroom, due to the bombing of Ukraine by the Russian Federation.



Besides the fact that we were in cold and dark, we had to publish news as quickly as possible from our phones and laptops with the little power left in the batteries. The challenge was to inform the public about what was happening, while the authorities did not have all the answers to the questions asked. I saw the newsroom mobilizing to face the situation together, and with the help received it was less difficult."

Veronica Fetco,

News Reporter:

"It's been a complicated year for our small news team. I tried to do my work responsibly and correctly, despite the large volume of work and the small number of employees of the department. I worked hard, I think, learned a lot and overcame some fears."



Breaking news has also been introduced to our Russian-speaking community. During the year, hundreds of news were written or translated for the Russian-language online edition. At the same time, ZdG continued the partnership with our colleagues from neighboring states, to offer the most important news from Ukraine, Georgia, Russia, and Belarus.



Our colleagues who do reports, interviews, and write about people have brought before readers the stories of hundreds of people who have seen their successes, challenges, difficulties, and victories in the pages of ZdG. Most of the texts were written based on hundreds of addresses from people who requested ZdG's help in solving problems, but also in promoting ideas, opinions and solutions.



Aneta Grosu,

readers' ombudsman, co-founder of ZdG:

"It was a year when people turned to ZdG as a last resort. Many trusted that journalists could help them get justice. For some it was not only justice that mattered, but also the fact that society could know about their problems. ZdG approached every message from its readers with responsibility and hope. Sometimes the approaches ended in concrete results, other times – there followed a deep silence from the state institutions responsible for solving citizens' problems. However, ZdG will continue to listen and hear from its readers."

The ZdG journalists received several awards during the year for this type of material:

- Prize in the contest "Journalists for diversity and inclusion", organized by the Independent Press Association ("

- 1st place in the written press category in the first edition of the national contest of journalistic materials "Journalists against misinformation".
- The prize of the Center for Independent Journalism and the Office of the Embassy of the Kingdom of the Netherlands in the **Tulip Press Awards contest**, for the approach to human rights in our materials.















Marina Gorbatovschi,

Reporter:

"In 2022 I focused on the objective reflection of the war started by Russia in Ukraine. First, I collected and debunked the fakes about the invasion, then I collected disturbing stories from the Ukrainian refugees who were sheltered by the Moldovan citizens with such solidarity."





The most read reports were also about the people who suffered from inadequate social and medical services, but also about the victims of the Russian war in Ukraine. The most read interviews were also the dialogues with the people who can best explain how the economic and financial problems in Moldova can be overcome.

We reiterate that every week ZdG publishes stories based on calls from readers, but also letters from citizens. Articles inspired by them are specially marked on the site.

The most important topics addressed by ZdG in 2022 necessarily also had video versions. And not just one version. To reach the audience on all platforms, we often need to adapt the content. This was the new element we tried to introduce in 2022 - to make videos tailored for each social network: YouTube, Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, Telegram. ZdG can also be listened to, not just read. We are present on the main audio platforms: Apple Podcasts, Google Podcasts, Spotify. Some of ZdG's Facebook video stories have received over a million views, confirming the public's interest in the materials we make.



Anatolie Eşanu,

Head of the Video Department:

"My colleagues and I in the Video Department like to say that we give "life" to articles written in the newspaper, with the help of image and sound. Investigations, reports, and video interviews remained a priority for us in 2022, but we also continued to publish short, "no comment" clips, vox populi, explanatory videos. In 2022 we launched two new podcasts, both in audio and video format (<u>Tinerii de Gardă</u> and <u>ZdCe</u> Podcast), and Săptămâna de Gardă - a synthesis of the most important news of the week, managed to attract an increasingly large audience. Beyond Investigations is another video product shot in our small studio – a show where reporters tell the "behind the scenes" details of investigations. And for 2023, we are planning to launch a new video format, through which we aim to reach a new audience, so far unfamiliar with journalistic investigations."





THE YOUNG PEOPLE FROM THE ZDG TEAM



Ziarul de Gardă constantly opens the door to young people, giving them the opportunity to learn from award-winning reporters how to do responsible and ethical journalism. In 2022, the ZdG team was joined by Vasile Ursache, a recent graduate of the Faculty of Journalism. In just a few months, he managed to accumulate enough experience, managing to pass his first test of investigative journalism. He went, together with the experienced ZdG team, to do an exercise of undercover journalism, thus contributing to the award-winning investigation "Protesters to rent".



Vasile Ursache, reporter:

"On my own skin, I felt how working for a month in the editorial office of ZdG, I learned and acquired more things than in the three years at university. Obviously, I received a good foundation at the faculty, but it only prepares you for what comes next in the profession. In the newsroom, in addition to the skills to document and write a journalistic material, young people gain social experiences and contribute to the smooth functioning of the newsroom, performing sometimes less visible but necessary tasks. The most important thing is that they have someone to guide them, notice the things they are doing wrong and give them advice."

In 2022, ZdG turned 18, and it created a Youth Board in order to better know the problems faced by the young generation and to better contribute to their solution. They consult ZdG on topics and themes about young people and also make a podcast and write editorials, in which they address topics of interest to young citizens and their families.



ZDG OFFLINE

ZdG went out of the newsroom during 2022, organizing several meetings with readers – in different villages and cities, in libraries, and universities.



The ZdG team visited the "Dimitrie Cantemir" District Library in Ungheni on Friday, November 25, where they met several librarians from the district, as well as high school students from the city.

ZDG AT THE MUSEUM



For the second year in a row, on December 9, International Anti-Corruption Day, ZdG organized the annual exhibition of investigative journalists. In 2022 the exhibition was entitled "Corruption and War" and attracted groups of prosecutors, students, journalists, and schoolchildren.





Also, ZdG organized a photo exhibition named "On the edge of war", held at the Bogdan Petriceicu Haşdeu Library.

THE ZDG SCHOOL

The members of the editorial team are constantly learning and sharing experience. In 2022, ZdG reporters visited international journalistic events in Norway, Italy, the Czech Republic, Georgia, Slovakia, Germany and Latvia to gain knowledge and experience regarding investigative journalism, tools and technologies in journalism and media management.

Alina Radu reported on ZdG's experiences in combating disinformation at the "Media in times of war" Conference, which took place in Tbilisi, Georgia in October 2022.

WHO PAYS FOR THE MOST COMPLICATED KIND OF JOURNALISM?

7iarul de Gardă became well-known because of its independence and because of the most complicated kind of journalism – investigations. But independence, fairness, and professionalism come at a cost, and these costs are extremely difficult to cover. ZdG does not accept money from political entities, nor from businesses that have integrity problems. Thus, the methods of financial support remain few and sober. ZdG sells subscriptions, but the category of subscribers is people with low incomes who cannot pay high prices. ZdG sells advertising space, but in the year 2022, because of the war, it was the honest and transparent businesses that were most affected and had no advertising budgets.

Because of the war, ZdG suffered financially like the whole society: the price of printing paper increased by more than 30%, the price of newspaper distribution increased by more than 40%, the price of electricity, heating – increased, wages were devalued due to inflation and newsroom revenues in general have declined. In 2022 ZdG launched a financial support project, which offers possibilities to all those who wish to support independent media - to offer the support they can.



Aliona Cenușă,

ZdG finance manager:

"The words that define the year 2022 for the ZdG editorial office are challenges and difficulties, on the one hand, but also resistance and resilience, search for solutions, strategies and, of course, the constant support from the community.

An unexpectedly difficult year - emotionally difficult, but also financially, caused by the war near our borders, which led to a chain of price increases, to problems importing raw materials (in our case, printing paper), to the reduction of funding to maintain the newsroom, to the overwork of the team.

It's been worth all the effort to see how the wave of support from ZdG readers continues to grow, either by subscribing directly or giving subscriptions, or by monthly donations made at https://www.patreon.com/join/zdg, or by direct support via paypal or in ZdG's bank account, either by purchasing products from https://zdg.one/, or by redirecting 2% at the end of the year from income tax and other creative methods of support. "

ZdG survived thanks to the community of readers who constantly encouraged us and thanks to the community of foreign donors, who offered grants to independent newsrooms and civil society throughout the year. Some donors supported us for a few months, others for the whole year, some supported a column or covered our development needs, but each contributed to ZdG's resilience and our mission to inform the public about the most difficult processes.

Internews Moldova is one of the fundamental partners of ZdG, as it has provided support during the last years for fundamental transformations and for the growth of the newsroom. The US **Embassy in Moldova** has been a ZdG partner for 18 years and in 2022 offered us support to develop journalistic materials based on citizens' requests, including investigations, reports, and news, but also supported the launch of the annual exhibition "Corruption and War", held at the National Museum of History. **USAID Moldova**, through some partners, helped us survive the economic blows we received because of the war. Free Press Unlimited in Amsterdam, through the Russian Language News Exchange, supported the activity of our Russian language page, but also the exchange of content and best practices with independent newsrooms that do responsible journalism about what is happening in Ukraine, Russia, Belarus, and other difficult regions. **NED** has given us support in explaining corruption and how war and hardship are deepened by lack of transparency. **The Canadian Embassy** supported the newsroom with a project in which reporters explained the war and how we can build peace, including through the exhibition "On the edge of war", held at the "Bogdan Petriceicu Haşdeu" Library. Millenium DPI partners supported the column on healthy justice.

The partners from Zinc Network, Amnesty International Moldova, the EU Delegation in the Republic of Moldova, the Council of Europe, the office in Chişinău also offered us partial contributions, helping us to explain fakes and manipulations. DRRM (Department for Relations with the Republic of Moldova) supported ZdG with printing and paper expenses for several months.

CONCLUSIONS:

- Investigative journalism in Moldova remains extremely important and in demand, fueling many criminal cases and investigations by public authorities;
- Public interest journalism teams bear the greatest pressure from the public, being asked to provide verified information in the fastest way;
- Reporters spend a lot of time and financial resources for access to information, for judicial processes, for elucidating cases of online harassment.
- Young reporters are not prepared at the faculties to bear these professional pressures in independent teams, overloaded in particular during difficult periods (pandemic, war, crises), that is why the majority of independent journalism teams face staffing crises;
- Investigative teams lack financial sustainability and economic security, investigations cannot be sold, attract no publicity and are expensive;
- The advertising market in Moldova is still distorted and is oriented towards mass media that do not address difficult issues such as corruption, or towards influencers that do not request or ensure the transparency of advertising contracts;
- Crowdfunding projects remain underdeveloped, as the state's citizens are mostly poor, but also lack the education to pay for media products.



During the year 2023, ZdG will continue its activity, editing the largest printed newspaper in Moldova, feeding one of the most popular web pages in the state with news up to the minute, offering attractive content to communities on social networks. But most importantly, ZdG will continue to follow the corruption, the transformations in the judicial system, the punishments given to those who abused the public budget and of course, the pro-European agenda of the Republic of Moldova.

After the pandemic and the war, after so many unplanned difficulties, the ZdG team is more stoic and firm in its work, even if at the beginning of 2023 it is just as difficult for us.

In 2023, any citizen - from Moldova, from the diaspora, from any corner of the world knows where to can find out up to the minute about the most important things happening here, and we consider it an honorable mission to serve the public interest.
